DALLAS ACADEMIC LESSON OBSERVATION FORM

Developed by Dallas Independent School District for the academic school year, the Dallas Academic Lesson Observation Form is also used during the summer to provide feedback to teachers. Assessors use the form to record data upon entering the classroom, at 10-minute intervals throughout the class, and prior to leaving the class. Completed forms are provided to teachers after the observation is complete.
